- Hybrid Hackathon hosted on 26th to 27th February 2022 in partnership with Thulamela Business Forum in Vhembe, Limpopo.
- Thulamela Business Forum (TBF) is a non-profit business forum that aims to meet the needs of businesses in the region.
- The hackathon physical event took place in Vhembe, Limpopo, and virtual participation was managed by EPF at their head offices at 35 Ferguson Rd, Illovo, Sandton.
- 100+ young digital innovators in programming, marketing, finance and business were selected from a pool of over 200 applicants.
- Hackathon Theme: How can we help farmers become smart farmers using tech for their produce tracing and route to market?

- Context: According to Crop Tracker, "Detailed farm record keeping is crucial when making important business or planning decisions for your operation. Keeping records of farming activities is not only poor business practice, but it is also illegal. For farms, records must be kept about expenses, labour, chemicals, pesticides, harvests and yields, plantings, shippings, and FSMA and GAP compliance. In order to practice safe farming, it is essential to be able to look back and see the full history of the product, from planting to shipping. A well-organized record will greatly simplify this process and make auditing season much simpler."
- Jasmine Mokwena, EPF's Marketing & Hackathon Coordinator says. "Agriculture is one of the 10 public sector issues that Empire Partner Foundation has mandated itself to solve through technology. EPF partnered with TBF to address the challenges that South African small to medium-scale farmers face in tracing their produce from farm en route to market, to generate income and support their families. This was EPF's first offsite hackathon for the team, which proved to be a success. EPF is thrilled to have the opportunity in effecting change in Limpopo and for a Limpopo team to have taken the cup in their home ground, was a bonus."
- Ntsieni Mbulungeni, Chairperson of TBF, says: "This hackathon will build the foundation to give the youth the experience and confidence in using the technology to bring solutions that are relevant to improve the local economy and scale these solutions to other relevant markets". "New digital capabilities offer us a unique and immediate opportunity to transform food systems and accelerate impact towards zero hunger. The new focus group will significantly contribute towards these efforts, bringing together AI [artificial intelligence] and IOT [internet of things] as key enablers behind new capabilities for digital agriculture."



- Team "Makwarela Campus 123" won the hackathon. Their solution is a mobile app called, SMART FARMING, making it easy to monitor a plant's growth, development, and distribution. In this way, farmers can stay informed about climate change, current market trends, and demand.
- Tony Mamphiswana, Makwarela Campus 123's Team Leader says: 'We honestly didn't expect to take first place, but we had faith and hopes in our solution. We had gathered enough information and put all our efforts to develop an efficient tech solution."
